Protocol amending

THE REGIONAL AGREEMENT FOR THE AFRICAN BROADCASTING AREA (Geneva, 1963)

Preamble

The undersigned Delegates of the Administrations of:

meeting in Geneva for a Regional Administrative Conference of the Members of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area, convened in conformity with Article 63 in connection with Article 62 of the International Telecommunication Convention (Nairobi, 1982),

mindful of Article 7 of the Regional Agreement for the African Broadcasting Area (Geneva, 1963),

having considered Resolution No. COM5/3 of the Regional Administrative Conference for the Planning of the VHF Sound Broadcasting (Region 1 and Part of Region 3) (Geneva, 1984),

have adopted, subject to the approval of their Administrations, the following provisions relating to the abrogation of certain parts of the Regional Agreement for the African Broadcasting Area (Geneva, 1963) and contained in the present Protocol.

ARTICLE 1

Definitions

For the purposes of the present Protocol, the following terms shall have the meanings defined below:

Union: The International Telecommunication Union.

Secretary-General: The Secretary-General of the Union.

Convention: The International Telecommunication Convention (Nairobi, 1982).

Radio Regulations: The Radio Regulations (Geneva, 1979) annexed to the Convention.

African Broadcasting Area: The area designated as such in Nos. 400 to 403 of the Radio Regulations, i.e.:

- a) African countries, parts of countries, territories and groups of territories situated between the parallels 40° South and 30° North;
- b) islands in the Indian Ocean West of meridian 60° East of Greenwich, situated between the parallel 40° South and the great circle arc joining the points 45° East, 11°30′ North and 60° East, 15° North;
- c) islands in the Atlantic Ocean East of line B defined in No. 398 of these Regulations, situated between the parallels 40° South and 30° North.

Agreement (1963): The Regional Agreement for the African Broadcasting Area (Geneva, 1963) concerning the use of frequencies by the broadcasting service in the very high frequency and ultra high frequency bands.

<u>Protocol</u>: The present Protocol amending the Agreement (1963) by abrogating certain parts thereof.

Regional Agreement (1984): The Regional Agreement Relating to the Use of the Band 87.5 - 108 MHz for FM Sound Broadcasting (Region 1 and Part of Region 3) (Geneva, 1984).

<u>Plan of the Agreement (1963)</u>: The "Plan for Sound Broadcasting Stations in the Frequency Band 87.5 - 100 Mc/s", as contained in Annex 2 to the Agreement (1963).

Plan of the Regional Agreement (1984): The Plan forming Annex 1 to the Regional Agreement (1984) and its Appendix.

Administration: Any governmental department or service responsible for discharging the obligations undertaken in the Convention and the Regulations.

Party to the Agreement (1963): Any Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area having approved, or acceded to, the Agreement (1963).

ARTICLE 2

Abrogation and replacement of certain parts of the Agreement (1963)

The parts of the Agreement (1963) relating to sound broadcasting in the band 87.5 - 100 MHz and listed in the <u>Annex</u> to the Protocol shall be abrogated and replaced by the Regional Agreement (1984) and by the Plan of the Regional Agreement (1984).

ARTICLE 3

Entry into force of the Protocol

The Protocol shall enter into force on 1 July 1987, at 0001 hours UTC, i.e. the date of the entry into force of the Regional Agreement (1984).

ARTICLE 4

Approval of the Protocol

1. Any Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area who is a Party to the Agreement (1963) and a signatory of the Protocol shall notify its approval of the Protocol, as soon as possible and, at any rate, prior to the entry into force of the Protocol (1 July 1987, at 0001 hours UTC), to the Secretary-General, who shall at once inform the other Members of the Union. The Secretary-General is authorized to take, at any time, any appropriate action aiming at the timely implementation of the provisions of the present paragraph.

At the time of signature of the present Protocol the following 11 Members of the Union were Parties to the Agreement (1963): Egypt (Arab Republic of), Spain (with respect to the Canaries), Ethiopia, France (with respect to the Department of Reunion), Kenya (Republic of), Nigeria (Federal Republic of), Uganda (Republic of), Senegal (Republic of), Sierra Leone, South Africa (Republic of) and Tanzania (United Republic of).

2. The other Members of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area signatory of the Protocol may notify their approval of the latter to the Secretary-General, who shall at once inform the other Members of the Union; it being understood that such approval shall also imply the approval of, or accession to, the Agreement (1963).

ARTICLE 5

Accession to the Protocol

- 1. Any Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area who is a Party to the Agreement (1963), but not a signatory of the Protocol, shall accede to the latter as soon as possible and shall deposit, at any rate, prior to the entry into force of the Protocol (1 July 1987, at 0001 hours UTC) an instrument of accession with the Secretary-General, who shall at once inform the other Members of the Union. The Secretary-General is authorized to take, at any time, any appropriate action aiming at the timely implementation of the provisions of the present paragraph.
- 2. Accession to the Protocol shall be made without reservation and shall become effective on the date on which the instrument of accession is received by the Secretary-General.

ARTICLE 6

Approval of, or accession to, the Agreement (1963)

Any Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area approving, or acceding to, the Agreement (1963) after the adoption of the Protocol shall be considered as also approving, or acceding to, the Protocol.

ARTICLE 7

Revision of the Protocol

No revision of the Protocol shall be undertaken except by a competent administrative radio conference convened in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Convention, to which at least all the Members of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area shall be invited.

In WITNESS WHEREOF, the undersigned Delegates of the Members of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area mentioned above have, on behalf of the competent authorities of their respective countries, signed this Protocol in a single copy in the Arabic, English, French and Spanish languages; in case of dispute the French text shall be authentic. This copy shall remain deposited in the archives of the Union. The Secretary-General shall forward one certified true copy to each Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area.

Dear Sir,

The consultation carried out in accordance with the procedure of Article 62 of the Nairobi Convention, pursuant to the above referenced resolution, has resulted in the acceptance, by the required majority of the Members of the Union belonging to the African Broadcasting Area, of the proposal to convene a regional conference on 12 August 1985 in Geneva for an expected duration of two days with the agenda as proposed in Annex 2 to the mentioned resolution. An invitation to the Government of your country to send a delegation to the Regional Administrative Radio Conference of the Members of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area (Geneva, 12 August 1985) has been issued on 22 May 1985 by the Secretary-General.

The Board has studied the question of amendments to the Regional Agreement, Geneva 1963, which would ensure that it no longer applies to sound broadcasting stations in the band 87.5 - 100 MHz. In order to respond to the wishes expressed by the participants in the Regional Conference, Geneva 1984, as well as in conformity with No. 1003 of the Radio Regulations, the Board has the pleasure of enclosing as Annex to this letter a possible approach to the revision of the Agreement. The suggested changes in the Agreement (including the annexes) are kept to a minimum necessary to satisfy the objective set forth in the agenda of the Conference.

LOSS OF THE RIGHT TO VOTE

Under the Nairobi Convention, 1982:

- 1. Non signatory Members which have not acceded to the Convention are not entitled to vote at $Conferences^*$;
- A Member loses its right to vote when it is in arrears in its payments to the Union for so long as the amount of its arrears equals or exceeds the amount of the contribution due from it for the preceding two years (see No. 117 of the Convention).

At present, for one or other of the above reasons and until such time as the situation is rectified, the following Members for the African Broadcasting Area do not have the right to vote.



(as approved at the first Plenary Meeting)

The agenda of the Conference appears in $\frac{\text{Annex 2}}{\text{Conference}}$ to Resolution COM 5/3 of the Regional Administrative Conference for the Planning of VHF Sound Broadcasting (Region 1 and Part of Region 3) and is reproduced below.

Agenda of the Conference

To revise the Geneva Agreement (1963) by deleting the parts of the Agreement relating to sound broadcasting in the band 87.5-100~MHz which will be replaced by the Geneva 1984 Agreement.

While the requirements of the Convention must be observed, practical considerations dictate that a relatively simple structure should be adopted for a Conference expected to last only two days. It may be anticipated that most of the business of the Conference will be dealt with in the Plenary Meeting.

Bearing in mind Nos. 464 to 479 inclusive of the International Telecommunication Convention, Nairobi, 1982, the following committees with their terms of reference are suggested.

Committee 1 - Steering Committee

Terms of Reference:

To coordinate all matters connected with the smooth execution of work and to plan the order and number of meetings, avoiding overlapping wherever possible in view of the limited number of members of some delegations (Nos. 468 and 469 of the International Telecommunication Convention, Nairobi, 1982).

Committee 2 - Credentials Committee

Terms of Reference:

To verify the credentials of delegations and to report on its conclusions to the Plenary Meeting within the time specified by the latter (Nos. 390 and 471 of the International Telecommunication Convention, Nairobi, 1982).



Committee 3 - Budget Control Committee

Terms of Reference:

To determine the organization and the facilities available to the delegates, to examine and approve the accounts of expenditure incurred throughout the duration of the Conference and to report to the Plenary Meeting the estimated total expenditure of the Conference as well as the estimated costs entailed by the execution of the decisions of the Conference (Nos. 476 to 479 inclusive and No. 627 of the International Telecommunication Convention, Nairobi, 1982 and Nairobi Resolution No. 48).

Committee 4 - Editorial Committee

Terms of Reference

To perfect the form of the texts prepared, without altering the sense, for submission to the Plenary Meeting (Nos. 473 and 474 of the International Telecommunication Convention, Nairobi, 1982).

PLENARY MEETING

REPORT OF THE BUDGET CONTROL COMMITTEE

TO THE PLENARY MEETING

The Budget Control Committee held one meeting during the Conference and examined the questions arising from its terms of reference.

Under Nos 475 to 479 of the International Telecommunication Convention (Nairobi, 1982), the Committee's terms of reference are:

- a) to determine the organization and the facilities available to delegates;
- b) to examine and approve the accounts for expenditure incurred throughout the duration of the Conference;
- c) to estimate the costs that may be entailed by the execution of the decisions taken by the Conference.
- 1. <u>Determination of the organization and facilities available to delegates</u>

 No comments were made on the subject.

2. <u>Conference budget</u>

The Budget Control Committee took note of the Conference budget, amounting to 46,000 Swiss francs, which was approved by the Administrative Council at its 40th session (1985).

3. <u>Situation of Conference expenditure</u>

The Budget Control Committee estimated that the Conference expenditure will remain within the limits of the approved credits.



For reasons of economy, this document is printed in a limited number of copies. Participants are therefore kindly asked to bring their copies to the meeting since no others can be made available.

Sharing of Conference expenditure

4.

Since the present Conference is a Regional Conference within the meaning of No. 50 in Article 7 of the Nairobi Convention (1982), the expenditure arising from it must be borne by all the Members in the African Broadcasting area which have taken part in the Conference, according to the class of contribution they have chosen pursuant to No. 115 in Article 15 of the Convention. Annex 2 gives a list of the Members which must bear the costs of the Conference.

According to the statement of account in Annex 1, the total expenditure is estimated at 46,000 Swiss francs. On the basis of the number of contributory units of the Members required to bear the Conference expenditure (see Annex 2), the amount of the contributory unit may be estimated at 560.— Swiss francs.

Under Article 28 of the Financial Regulations of the Union, interest is payable on regional conference accounts after a period of 60 days from the date of their dispatch. Since invoices can probably be sent to participants on 31 October 1985, they should be settled not later than 31 December 1985. From 1 January 1986, they will be subject to interest at 3 % for the first 180 days and at 6 % thereafter.

In accordance with No. 479 of the Convention, this report will be transmitted together with any comments by the Plenary Meeting to the Secretary-General for reference to the Administrative Council at its next annual session.

The Plenary Meeting is requested to approve this report.

PROTOCOL AMENDING

THE REGIONAL AGREEMENT FOR THE AFRICAN BROADCASTING AREA (Geneva, 1963)

Preamble

The undersigned Delegates of the Administrations of:

[list of countries]

meeting in Geneva for a Regional Administrative Conference of the Members of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area, convened in conformity with Article 63 in connection with Article 62 of the International Telecommunication Convention (Nairobi, 1982),

mindful of Article 7 of the Regional Agreement for the African Broadcasting Area (Geneva, 1963),

having considered Resolution No. [COM5/3] of the Regional Administrative Conference for the Planning of the VHF Sound Broadcasting (Region 1 and Part of Region 3) (Geneva, 1984),

have adopted, subject to the approval of their Administrations, the following provisions relating to the abrogation of certain parts of the Regional Agreement for the African Broadcasting Area (Geneva, 1963) and contained in the present Protocol.

ARTICLE 1

Definitions

For the purposes of the present Protocol, the following terms shall have the meanings defined below:

Union: The International Telecommunication Union.

Secretary-General: The Secretary-General of the Union.

Convention: The International Telecommunication Convention (Nairobi, 1982).

Radio Regulations: The Radio Regulations (Geneva, 1979) annexed to the Convention.

African Broadcasting Area: The area designated as such in Nos. 400 to 403 of the Radio Regulations, i.e.:

- a) African countries, parts of countries, territories and groups of territories situated between the parallels $40^{\rm O}$ South and $30^{\rm O}$ North;
- b) islands in the Indian Ocean West of meridian 60° East of Greenwich, situated between the parallel 40° South and the great circle arc joining the points 45° East, $11^{\circ}30^{\circ}$ North and 60° East, 15° North;
- c) islands in the Atlantic Ocean East of line B defined in No. 398 of these Regulations, situated between the parallels $40^{\rm O}$ South and $30^{\rm O}$ North.

Agreement (1963): The Regional Agreement for the African Broadcasting Area (Geneva, 1963) concerning the use of frequencies by the broadcasting service in the very high frequency and ultra high frequency bands.

<u>Protocol</u>: The present Protocol amending the Agreement (1963) by abrogating certain parts thereof.

Regional Agreement (1984): The Regional Agreement Relating to the Use of the Band 87.5 - 108 MHz for FM Sound Broadcasting (Region 1 and Part of Region 3) (Geneva, 1984).

Sound Broadcasting Plan of the Agreement (1963): The "Plan for Sound Broadcasting Stations in the Frequency Band 87.5 - 100 Mc/s", as contained in Annex 2 to the Agreement (1963).

Plan of the Regional Agreement (1984): The Plan forming Annex 1 to the Regional Agreement (1984) and its Appendix.

Administration: Any governmental department or service responsible for discharging the obligations undertaken in the Convention and the Regulations.

Party to the Agreement (1963): Any Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area having approved, or acceded to, the Agreement (1963).*

ARTICLE 2

Abrogation and replacement of certain parts of the Agreement (1963)

The parts of the Agreement (1963) relating to sound broadcasting in the band 87.5 - 100 MHz and listed in the Annex to the Protocol shall be abrogated and replaced by the Regional Agreement (1984) and by the Plan of the Regional Agreement (1984).

ARTICLE 3

Entry into force of the Protocol

The Protocol shall enter into force on 1 July 1987, at 0001 hours UTC, i.e. the date of the entry into force of the Regional Agreement (1984).

ARTICLE 4

Approval of the Protocol

Any Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area who is a Party to the Agreement (1963) and a signatory of the Protocol shall notify its approval of the Protocol, as soon as possible and, at any rate, prior to its entry into force (1 July 1987, at 0001 hours UTC), to the Secretary-General, who shall at once inform the other Members of the Union. The Secretary-General is authorized to take, at any time, any appropriate action aimed at the timely implementation of the provisions of the present paragraph.

^{*} At the time of signature of the present Protocol the following 11 Members of the Union were Parties to the Agreement (1963): Egypt (Arab Republic of), Spain (with respect to the Canaries), Ethiopia, France (with respect to the Department of Reunion), Kenya (Republic of), Nigeria (Federal Republic of), Uganda (Republic of), Senegal (Republic of), Sierra Leone, South Africa (Republic of) and Tanzania (United Republic of).

2. The other Members of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area signatory of the Protocol may notify their approval of the latter to the Secretary-General, who shall at once inform the other Members of the Union, it being understood that such approval shall also imply the approval of, or accession to, the Agreement (1963).

ARTICLE 5

Accession to the Protocol

- Any Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area who is a Party to the Agreement (1963), but not a signatory of the Protocol, is invited to accede to the latter as soon as possible and to deposit, at any rate, prior to the entry into force of the Protocol (1 July 1987, at 0001 hours UTC) an instrument of accession with the Secretary-General, who shall at once inform the other Members of the Union. The Secretary-General is authorized to take, at any time, any appropriate action aimed at the timely implementation of the provisions of the present paragraph.
- 2. Accession to the Protocol shall be made without reservation and shall become effective on the date on which the instrument of accession is received by the Secretary-General.

ARTICLE 6

Approval of or accession to the Agreement (1963)

Any Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area approving or acceding to the Agreement (1963) after the adoption of the Protocol shall be considered as also approving or acceding to the Protocol.

ARTICLE 7

Revision of the Protocol

The Protocol shall be revised except by a competent administrative radio conference which is convened in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Convention and to which at least all the Members of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area shall be invited.

In WITNESS WHEREOF, the undersigned Delegates of the Members of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area mentioned above have, on behalf of the competent authorities of their respective countries, signed this Protocol in a single copy in the Arabic, English, French and Spanish languages; in case of dispute, the French text shall be authentic. This copy shall remain deposited in the archives of the Union. The Secretary-General shall forward one certified true copy to each Member of the Union in the African Broadcasting Area.

The Conference structure as set forth in Document AFR-DT/1 was adopted.

- 4. Election of the Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen of the Committees
- 4.1 the <u>Deputy Secretary-General</u> said that the Heads of Delegations had proposed the following nominations for the posts of Committee Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen:
- Committee 1 Steering Committee

Chairman: the Chairman of the Conference

Vice-Chairman: the Vice-Chairman of the Conference

Committee 2 - Credentials

Chairman - Mr. K.C. TIEMELE (Ivory Coast)

Vice-Chairman: Mr. J.M.B. SEKETE (Botswana)

Committee 3 - Budget control

Chairman: Mr. FAWZY YASSIN (Egypt)

Vice-Chairman: Mr. G. THIAM (Senegal)

Committee 4 - Editorial

Chairman: Miss A.M. NEBES (France)

Vice-Chairmen: Mr. M. BATES (United Kingdom)

Mr. R.A. ALVARINO ALVAREZ (Spain)

The proposals of the Heads of Delegations were adopted unanimously.

5. Composition of the Conference Secretariat

5.1 <u>The Deputy Secretary-General</u> suggested that the Conference should be assisted in the performance of its tasks by a Secretariat consisting of the following officials:

Plenary Meeting and Committee 1: Mr. CABRAL DE MELLO

Committee 2: Mr. MACHERET

Committee 3: Mrs. BERTINOTTI

Committee 4: Mr. TRAUB

The <u>Deputy Secretary-General</u> and the <u>representative of the IFRB</u> made brief introductory statements on Documents AFR/2 and AFR/3 which were self-explanatory.

6.2 The <u>Chairman</u> invited the meeting to consider the draft Protocol amending the Regional Agreement for the African Broadcasting Area (Geneva, 1963).

6.3 Article 1 - Definitions

- 6.3.1 The <u>Legal Adviser</u> said that in the definition of "Plan of the Agreement (1963)", the term "Mc/s" in the French text should now read "MHz".
- 6.3.2 The <u>representative of the IFRB</u> said that, as noted in discussions on the same subject in respect of the European Broadcasting Area, the title of that definition should be:

"Sound Broadcasting Plan of the Agreement (1963)".

6.3.3 Referring to the definition of "administration", the <u>Legal Adviser</u> said that the French text should be amended to read, after the word "désigne":

"tout service ou département gouvernemental responsable des mesures à prendre pour exécuter les obligations de la Convention et des Règlements".

In the Spanish version of the same text, the final words "del Reglamento" should read "de sus Reglamentos".

6.3.4 In response to a question by the <u>delegate of Mali</u> about the footnote to the definition of "Party to the Agreement (1963)" the <u>Legal Adviser</u> said that a Member of the Union was deemed a party to an instrument only when, in addition to having signed it, it had transmitted to the Union the approval of its Government, thus signifying the latter's consent to be bound by the instrument concerned.

6.4 Article 5: Accession to the Protocol

6.4.1 The <u>Legal Adviser</u> said that the Regional Administrative Conference of Members of the Union in the European Broadcasting Area in discussing an identical article in its own Protocol, had decided to amend "shall accede" and "shall deposit" to "should accede" and "should deposit". The reasoning behind that decision was that the Members of the Union referred to in the paragraph had not signed the Protocol and could therefore not be obliged to accede to it.

- 6.4.2 The <u>delegate of Kenya</u> pointed out that if a Member of the Union had acceded to the 1963 Agreement, it had thereby agreed to be bound by it; "shall" was the normal legislative terminology, and "should" was not strong enough.
- 6.4.3 The <u>Legal Adviser</u> said that the phrase normally used was "may accede"; the European Regional Administrative Conference had amended it to "should accede" in order to make it stronger, but had been reluctant to go as far as "shall accede". The purpose of the Protocol was to ensure that, from the date of its entry into force, a date chosen to coincide with that of the entry into force of the 1984 Regional Agreement, sound broadcasting would be covered exclusively by the 1984 Regional Agreement. The African Regional Administrative Conference need not be bound by decisions made by the European Conference, however, and in the interests of clarity, he, like the delegate of Kenya, would prefer "shall" to "should".
- 6.4.4 The <u>delegate of Ghana</u> said that he endorsed the comment made by the Legal Adviser.
- 6.4.5 The representative of the IFRB said that the use of "shall" would be tantamount to dictating to an administration that it must accede to the Protocol, which was something that the Conference could not permit itself to do. In his view, "should" encouraged administrations to accede, without obliging them to do so, and was an appropriate compromise.
- 6.4.6 The <u>delegate of Kenya</u> suggested that the phrase in question be amended to read: "may accede to the latter as soon as possible and shall deposit", which had the dual advantage of being strong and leaving administrations free to choose their own course.
- 6.4.7 In response to queries from the <u>delegates of Algeria</u> and <u>France</u>, the <u>Chairman</u> said that the French version of Article 5 would be retained as it stood and that the Editorial Committee might be requested to concentrate on aligning the English text with that of the French.
- 6.4.8 The <u>Deputy Secretary-General</u> pointed out that the problem at hand was of a substantive nature and that the Editorial Committee was not empowered to make decisions on substance without direction from the Conference.
- 6.4.9 The <u>representative of the IFRB</u> proposed that the phrase in question be amended to read: "shall be invited to accede to the latter as soon as possible and shall deposit".
- 6.4.10 The delegate of Kenya endorsed that proposal.
- 6.4.11 There being no comments on the other Articles of the Protocol, the <u>Chairman</u> invited the meeting to consider the amendments required to the Regional Agreement (Geneva, 1963) in Document AFR/3.
- 6.5 The <u>Legal Adviser</u> said that the document contained an annex which listed the parts of the 1963 Agreement which were abrogated by virtue of Article 2 of the Protocol.
- 6.6 The <u>delegate of Kenya</u> noted that the former terminology, "Mc/s", was retained in the draft annex and suggested that the text should be updated.

- 6.7 The <u>Legal Adviser</u> pointed out that the terminology used in 1963 had been retained because it was those provisions specifically which were to be abrogated.
- 6.8 The <u>representative of the IFRB</u>, answering a question from the <u>delegate of Burundi</u>, said that Burundi's frequency requirements were reflected in the Plan.
- 6.9 The proposed amendments to the footnote to the Preamble, pages 2, 3, 18, 21, 24, 35-158, 321, 324, 327 and 385 of the Final Acts were <u>approved</u>.
- 6.10 Referring to the proposed amendment covering pages 335-342, the <u>Legal Adviser</u> said that the IFRB had included that section in order to make it clear that all of the parts, figures and references relating to sound broadcasting, including those in the technical annexes, were abrogated by the Protocol. The Secretariat had drafted an additional paragraph, which would soon be circulated, to make it clear that everything in the Agreement, including those items not mentioned in the enumeration which preceded the draft paragraph, was to be abrogated.
- 6.11 The <u>representative of the IFRB</u> said that he fully endorsed the proposed addition, which filled in all the gaps and made it absolutely clear which parts of the Agreement were abrogated by the Protocol.

With reference to the penultimate section of the draft annex proposed in Document AFR/3, he suggested that the Editorial Committee attempt to finalize the wording of the section covering pages 335-342 so that it could be considered by the Conference at its next Plenary Meeting.

- 7. Date by which the Credentials Committee must submit its conclusions
- 7.1 The <u>Secretary of Committee 2</u> said that the Committee must submit its conclusions to the Plenary before the signature of the Final Acts.

- 1. Report of the Budget Control Committee (Document AFR/9)
 - The report of the Budget Control Committee was approved.
- 2. First reading of the Final Acts (First series of texts submitted by the Editorial Committee) (Document AFR/10 (B.1))
- 2.1 Preamble

The Chairman of the Editorial Committee said that in the third preambular paragraph of the draft Protocol, the reference to "Resolution No. [COM 5/3]" should be corrected to read "Resolution No. 5."

2.2 Article 4

The <u>delegate of Spain</u> said that in paragraph 2, line 2 of the Spanish text the words "su aprobación" should be changed to read "la aprobación".

2.3 Article 7

The <u>delegate of the United Kingdom</u> pointed out that in the English text of Article 7 (page AFR B.1/4) the opening phrase should be amended to read "The Protocol shall not be revised etc.", inserting the word "not".

2.4 Annex

2.4.1 The Chairman of the Editorial Committee said that a decision had to be made whether to retain the passage in square brackets in paragraph 2 of the Annex.

Following a brief discussion, it was $\underline{\text{decided}}$ to retain the passage and to delete the square brackets.

- 2.4.2 The <u>delegate of Senegal</u> asked why the reference to the Africa Broadcasting Conference in page 3 of the Annex to Document No. AFR/3 was not carried through to paragraph 2 of the Annex to Document No. AFR/10, since the African Broadcasting Conference was charged with revising the Regional Agreement of 1963.
- 2.4.3 The representative of the IFRB said that paragraph 2 had been included at the suggestion of the Secretary-General and the Legal Adviser in order to make the Protocol self-contained and to obviate the need for further action on it by the African Conference.
- 2.4.4 The <u>Legal Adviser</u> added that although the first session of the African Broadcasting Conference would be revising the 1963 Agreement in 1986, no Final Acts would be adopted until its second session in 1989. Since the Protocol was to enter into force on 1 July 1987, it needed to be self-contained.

The first series of texts submitted by the Editorial Committee was approved as amended, on first reading.

- 3. Second reading of the Final Acts (Document AFR/10 (R.1))
- 3.1 The <u>Deputy Secretary-General</u> said that since no changes of substance had been made to the Final Acts on first reading, the Plenary meeting could proceed immediately to a reading of the amended Document AFR/10 (B.1).

Document AFR/10 was approved on second reading.
