tions, Professor W. Majewski, and other officials of the Ministry including Messrs. L. Kolatkowski, Deputy Minister, E. Janowski, Director General of Telecommunications, J. Fajkowski, Head of the Radio Communications Department, and Rutkowski, former Senior Counsellor in CCIR. Mr. Kirby presented Mr. Rut-kowski, with the CCIR Diplôme d'honneur, the CCIR honor award. The Minister presented Mr. Kirby the award of Distinguished Merit of the Polish telecommunication workers.

The 7th International Symposium on Electromagnetic Compatibility was held from 18 to 20 June at the Wrocław Technical University, under the general chairmanship of Professor Struzak, head of the Wrocław branch of the Institute of Telecommunications. There were about 200 participants and technical contributions from more than 20 countries. Mr Kirby chaired the opening plenary session, noting that the Wrocław Symposium had become one of the best known international technical conference on electromagnetic compatibility (EMC) and that it had achieved a high scientific level. Professor F. L. H. M. Stumpers, member of the Royal Academy of Science and Letters of the Netherlands and Vice-Chairman of the Symposium, gave the keynote address "Electromagnetic compatibility and the International Union of Radio Science".

Scientific papers were presented and discussed in Part 1 on electromagnetic environment, measurements, spectrum management, active line models for EMC, EMC and biology, mobile communications, radio wave propagation, EMC and wire communications. In Part

2, topics discussed were statistical concepts, lightning, EMC of radio systems,

electromagnetic fields and related problems, electromagnetic interference sources, immunity, antennas, modelling techniques.

Societies and organizations co-operating in the Symposium included the International Union of Radio Science (URSI), the CCIR, the CCITT, the International Special Committee on Radio Interference (CISPR), the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) Region 8 — Europe, the Academy of Sciences of the USSR, and numerous national scientific and engineering societies of Europe.

The Vice-President of the Polish Society of Electrical Engineers (Stowarzyszenie Elektrykow Polskich), Professor B. Paszkowski, presented the Society's Gold Medal of Distinction to Professor Stumpers and to Mr. Kirby, for distinguished contributions to electromagnetic compatibility.

he VIIIth Plenary Assembly of the International Telegraph and Telephone Consultative Committee opened at the Palacio de Congresos in Málaga-Torremolinos (Spain) on 8 October 1984.

At the opening session Mr. G. Entrena Cuesta (Spain) was elected Chairman of the Plenary Assembly, Messrs. A. J. Falcone (Argentina), M. Kojima (Japan), E. S. Barbely (United States), D. Aithnard (Togo) and P. N. Voronin (USSR) were elected Vice-Chairmen.

Some 600 delegates representing 93 countries, 10 international organizations and five United Nations specialized agencies attended the Plenary Assembly which adopted 266 new Recommendations and approved amendments to 373 existing Recommendations. Some 400 Questions, about half of them new and the remainder for further study, were adopted for consideration during the next four-year period.
